

## CVARP Partners in Adult Education

Providing educational opportunities for disadvantaged adults requires a team effort. CVARP is proud to partner with the following agencies to provide adult basic educational services including GED preparation assistance, introductory English language and citizenship classes (IEL/CE), resume building, personal finance classes, computer/technology classes as well as internship possibilities for our students.

**Camp Verde Community Library and Town of Camp Verde**- partners providing facility use and staff support in providing educational classes to the community.

**Yavapai Community Foundation**- provided nearly \$9,000 in seed money in 2018/2019 to begin an internship program at CVARP that will provide students with quality work experiences to complement their GED preparation. CVARP will be seeking new 'employment' partners to continue the program into future years.

**Dollar General Foundation**- provided \$5,000 in 2018/2019 to purchase new laptops for student use in GED preparation classes as well as computer/technology classes, resume building classes and other instruction requiring computers. The Dollar General Foundation funds also paid for the student seats in the on-line program "GED Academy" which is used in CVARP's program.

**Sedona Community Foundation**- provided \$3,500 in 2017/2018 and \$2,400 2018/2019 for the general operations of CVARP. Those funds are used to pay wages to the teachers in the GED and IEL/CE classes.

**Christ Lutheran Church Endowment Fund**- provided \$2,000 for the instructional services in the 2018/2019 IEL/CE classes.

**Rosenbluth Family Charitable Foundation**- provided \$2000 for the instructional services in the 2018/2019 GED preparation classes.

**Donald and Lou Soldwedel**- in 2017 CVARP was left an endowment from the Soldwedel Estate which provides general funds for the continued operation of CVARP. Donald and Lou were the founders of Western Newspapers.

**Citizens of the Verde Valley**- provided nearly \$10,000 in tax credit and other donations for the general operation of CVARP in 2017/2018.
